What's Next For Moore?

Moore's lawyer says despite winning the case justice hasn't been completely served.

After being on trial 3 times and spending years behind bars, Daniel Wade Moore is now a free man.

It's a verdict Moore's lawyer was glad to hear.

Attorney Jake Watson said, "I am happy for Daniel, happy that 12 people in Morgan County have spoken the truth and that is that Daniel Moore is not guilty."

Watson said despite winning the case justice wasn't completely served.

"There are no winners because Daniel has served 9 years in jail and 3 months on death row so he's certainly not a winner, almost 10 years of his life have been taken away and he most certainly will be damaged by it and also there is someone out there that did this."

From April 2002 to October 2003 Daniel Moore and Bryan Jones shared a jail cell.

Jones was facing capital murder charges for the death of a 4 year old boy.

He was also found not guilty.

Jones said besides being behind bars and losing years of your life, re-entering society can also be painful.

"When you're charged with something like that to where you can't go to work and I've gone to work at places and after they do a background check they let you go," said Jones.

Jones said being unemployed can make it hard to live and for him to raise his daughter.

He said what's even harder is making up for lost time with family, a family that may have changed over the years.

Jones adds that crowds will make Moore uncomfortable and he'll have to adjust to new technology.

Moore's attorney says he cannot be tried again for the same case because of the double jeopardy law.
